The scientific community overwhelmingly agrees that we have less than 10 years to drastically cut our greenhouse gas emissions, or humanity will suffer devastating consequences. By the end of the century, more of the world's seas could be hot, acidic, and lifeless – with catastrophic implications for marine life, Earth's climate, and the food security of billions of people.

As the Executive Vice President of Field Programs at Conservation International, I oversee our conservation work in more than 70 countries. <u>And I can tell you the needs are vast – and growing.</u>

This past spring, I visited our staff and partners working in Madagascar. It's a place very dear to my heart – it's where I first saw the fragility of our relationship with nature and was inspired to pursue a career in conservation.

It's one of the most important places for biodiversity in the world. There are many species that exist in Madagascar and nowhere else on earth. But it's also a poor country with fewer resources to dedicate to conservation work.

Madagascar has one of the highest deforestation rates globally due to logging and slash-and-burn agriculture, and it is estimated that only 10% of its forest is remaining today. Conservation International has worked in Madagascar for over 20 years, helping communities protect nearly 400,000 acres of rainforest for the benefit of the people of Madagascar.

Our teams work with local governments and families to stop illegal deforestation activities. And we train farmers on sustainable farming practices and provide equipment and staffing support to help them succeed. In one very remote region of the country, our team carried bags of seeds on their backs while trekking for four days to get the seeds into the hands of local farmers.

I left Madagascar feeling incredibly proud and grateful for the opportunity to partner with local people who best understand what is needed. <u>At Conservation International</u>, we understand that securing the health of Earth's climate, ecosystems and biodiversity is essential to the survival of all people. And we are committed to ensuring that local communities are at the center of conservation solutions.

In every region where we work, weather is becoming more extreme. In many countries, people who are already living on the margins face new challenges from droughts and floods, fires and superstorms, heat waves and even cold snaps.

The climate crisis is not coming. *It is here.* And it will impact every person on the planet. That's why Conservation International has made it a central focus of our work and why we're urgently expanding our climate work now.
